

2003 Republican Medicare Conference Report

Premium	\$35 (estimate) (\$420 per year)
Deductible	\$250
Co-insurance	25% for \$251-2,250
Out-of-Pocket Maximum	\$3,600 (but not really, because you still pay 5% copayment once in catastrophic coverage)
Coverage Gap	\$2,850 gap (for drug costs between \$2,250 to \$5,100, there is no coverage)

Costs/Savings Chart

If your income is above 150% of the federal poverty line and your drug costs are...	You will pay ... <i>[including premiums & deductible]</i>
\$500/yr.	pay: \$ 733..... 146.6% save: - \$ 233..... -46.6%
\$1,000/yr	pay: \$ 858..... 85.8% save: \$ 142..... 14.2%
\$2,000/yr	pay: \$ 1,108..... 55.4% save: \$ 892..... 44.6%
\$5,000/yr	pay: \$ 3,920..... 78.4% save: \$ 1,080..... 21.6%
\$6,000/yr	pay: \$ 4,065..... 67.7% save: \$ 1,935..... 32.3%

According to CBO ...

10% of seniors spend \$0 on Rx Drugs;
83% spend between \$1 and \$5,999; and
... only 7% spend over \$6,000.*
